



Safeguarding across the Curriculum

At Redhill Primary Academy, the protection of children is the responsibility of everyone. We aim to make all within the school feel safe and we have clear roles and responsibilities in place for that to happen. Safeguarding is carefully woven into our curriculum offer, ensuring that children have a broad understanding of how our school helps to keep them safe whilst in the classroom and beyond.

All schools have responsibilities relating to the safety of children in their care. Paragraph 41 of statutory guidance on **Keeping Children Safe in Education**, the Department for Education states:

“Schools should consider how children may be taught about safeguarding, including online, through teaching and learning opportunities. This may include covering relevant issues through PSHE ...”
