





ABOUT OUR NURSERY

We are situated within the grounds of Redhill Primary Academy and are part of the Thomas Telford

Multi Academy Trust. We are fortunate to have a large purpose-built Nursery, with a wealth of designated areas, to enrich learning across all areas of the curriculum. Although we are part of the Academy, we need to remind parents/carers that having a place at Redhill Nursery does not guarantee you a place in Reception. (See Telford and Wrekin website for Admissions Information). We have designated areas for resources and continuous provision both inside and outside, enabling children to access all areas of learning and development within the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum..

We have:

An art studio: where children can celebrate their creativity through a variety of different media.

Construction areas: where children can plan what they are going to create and build narratives around them.

A home corner and a large playhouse: here children can develop upon their real-life experiences to role play with their peers.

Understanding of the world areas: children can continue to develop their love of the natural world through observation, investigation, a vegetable garden and a planting wall.

Water and sand play areas: developing basic mathematical and literacy skills. Quiet reading room and reading area: with a large selection of books and cushions for the children to enjoy and share with their peers.

Small world: children can continue to develop their creativity through building narratives around the objects in the small world.

Sensory Garden: for investigation, sensory experiences and storytelling. **Forest School:** for exploration, physical development and imagination.

Nursery Garden: developing healthy eating through growing and looking after their own fruit and vegetables.

Climbing Frame — for active play and Forest School — for adventure!

Outside we have a variety of exciting opportunities to develop gross motor skills through the large climbing frame, trikes, balancing beams and other outside play equipment. Within all these areas, the development of children's communication and language skills is paramount, as we believe that as children develop speaking and listening skills, they're building the foundations for literacy and learning. These skills are the building blocks for all other areas of learning and development. Language development is best supported in a playful language environment full of stories, songs, rhymes, signs, talking and imaginative play. Children explore different sounds, symbols, and words in their everyday world and through their play.

THE EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE

The Early Years framework sets the standards that all early years providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well from birth until they reach the age of five. It describes how children should be kept safe, cared for and engaged in purposeful play, with specialized adults who work in partnership with all concerned, so that the children achieve their best in those crucial early years of their life.

At Redhill Nursery we endeavor to do just that! We have high aspirations for children's

achievement, irrespective of their circumstances or starting points.

As a setting we acknowledge that parents are the primary teacher and so we work alongside you to gain knowledge about your child so we can plan and provide the best quality provision. Your Key Worker will talk to you everyday about your child's interests and progress in Nursery and gather information from you about their interests and progress at home too. Together we can then fill those gaps in learning and development and work on the next steps with a shared vision for your child, providing guidance on how to continue with activities at home to support learning. Children with additional

needs are provided with intervention, using support programmes from outside agencies and systems to give the best possible help for your child. (Visit the Academy website for further information on SEND offer.)

Children achieve when parents and professionals work together as it is important to remember that you know more about your child than anyone else. Understanding what your child is doing when they are with others at Nursery will help you be aware of how well they are developing and learning in a different setting from home. Nursery staff will observe your child in focus tasks and when working in child-initiated play so that they can build a profile of your child as a learner and make informed decisions as to whether they are beginning, developing or secure against set criteria bands of learning. The part you play in their learning is valued by all our Nursery staff, so regular discussions about your child's development and learning will ensure that together we can make a difference to their future.



LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

There are seven areas of learning and development that shape the provision in Early Years. All areas are important and are inter-connected:





Communication and Language lays a foundation for learning and development, guiding and supporting children's thinking, while underpinning their emerging literacy skills. Language is more than words. The children are given opportunities to experience a rich language environment, to develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves and to speak and listen in a range of situations.

Physical development underpins a child's learning and development. A child's physical journey relies on opportunities to be active and interactive and in the development of their coordination, control and movement. Children must also be helped to understand the importance of physical activity and making healthy food choices.

Personal, social and emotional development is fundamental to all other aspects of lifelong development and learning and is key to a child's wellbeing and resilience. It involves helping children develop a positive sense of themselves and others; to form positive relationships and respect for others and to develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings.



SPECIFIC AREAS

Literacy development involves encouraging children to link sounds and letters and to begin to read and write. Children must be given access to a wide range of reading materials (books, poems and other written materials) to ignite their interest.

Mathematics involves providing children with opportunities to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems and to describe shapes, space and measures.

Understanding the World involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment.

Expressive arts and design involves enabling children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts in a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play and design and technology.



TRANSITION FROM HOME TO NURSERY AND THEN FROM NURSERY TO SCHOOL

We are very sensitive to the emotional needs of children so understand that a smooth induction into Nursery will help your child settle quickly. Our induction programme enables both you and your child to feel happy and safe in our Nursery before you leave them to stay on their own. A Key Worker will provide this security and consistency, enabling you to have peace of mind that your child is being cared for by a friendly and dedicated Early Years trained practitioner. A planned programme of events with the Academy throughout the year, enable children to realise that other situations and places can be friendly too, so whichever Primary School your child transfers to after Nursery, they will have had a positive experience of 'big' school.

Uniform

Uniform is required in Nursery. Please see link for online ordering on the Academy website.

In addition to the uniform you may like to purchase an apron, as Nursery is where a lot of messy exploration of materials takes place!

Funding

All children are entitled to 15 hours funding (or 30 hours if eligible) after the term in which they turn three. We also have a limited number of 2-year-old funded places available.

BOYS

A DAY AT NURSERY

A typical session within our Nursery includes whole and small group tasks focusing on the key knowledge and skills through our carefully planned curriculum across all areas of learning, in which gaps within learning or next steps are addressed. There are opportunities of free flow, inside and outside through child-initiated activities where children are able to apply the knowledge and skills taught within their play. Throughout the week children will take part in a Welly Walk, PE, Music and Show and Tell (sharing and talking about items from home of interest to your child or on a theme). The Nursery staff will continually assess through observations, quality interactions, questioning and play with your child, following their interests and adapting the provision. The enriched provision allows each individual to apply their learning through play, challenge themselves and develop as confident learners. Children learn and develop well in enabling environments with teaching, scaffolding and support from adults who respond to their individual needs, helping them to build their learning over time.

There are plenty of opportunities for your child to develop their personal, social and emotional wellbeing by making friends and working collaboratively or independently. Through the language enriched environment and a nurturing learning space, children will continually develop their speaking and listening skills, developing their language skills effectively, building their self—confidence. In Nursery you will see children exploring and playing, creating, and thinking critically, whilst forming relationships with peers and adults, encouraging independent and confident learners. Early learning is key to your child's future.

The first five years of your child's life are the most crucial. Caring families and good quality
