Listening and attention/Understanding / Speaking

In Nursery we encourage speech, communication and vocabulary through a wide range of planned and child initiated experiences. are reading the book 'Each Peach, Pear, Plum by Janet and Alan Allberg

This story reinforces rhyme in the text and has Nursery rhyme and Fairytale characters hidden in the beautifully detailed illustrations. <u>Nursery rhymes</u> are an excellent way of children exploring rhyme and rhythm and can be shared with families as they are familiar across all ages.

<u>Fairytales</u> explore feelings with both good and bad characters and help children to learn the sequence and pattern of a traditional tale ready for when they learn to write and read stores of their own.

PRIME AREA:

Physical Development

Moving and handling

During PE sessions we will be exploring crawling, rolling, jumping and balancing. We will practise small apparatus skills of throwing and catching and kicking. We will follow The Cool Kids programme and Busy Feet.

In our outside play we will use bikes and climbing frames and a wide variety of large equipment to encourage control and mastery of movements.

Fine motor skills will be developed through threading, painting, cutting, pegs, tweezers etc i sensory based play.

Health and self-care

Throughout the Nursery day healthy eating ,exercise and hygiene are emphasised by photos, activities and modelling

Development

Making relationships Throughout all our daily routines and provision Nursery we promote good communication between children and their peers and between staff and children. In our key groups children have opportunities to do circle times to get to know each other.

Self-confidence and self —awareness

At Redhill Nursery we endeavour to build children's

continually

self-confidence and promote self-awareness, whilst managing feelings and behaviour in an environment of trust analyzare. We do this by having key groups, Show and Tell, a child-accessible environment and supportive adults.

Writing /reading

In our daily 'Letters and Sounds 'sessions children will learn how to say, read and write sounds and begin to spell words. All children have access to high quality texts both fiction and non—fiction to encourage (love of reading.

SPECIFIC AREA: Mathematics

Numbers

We will use many songs to help us count eg 'Or rosy apple hanging on a tree' our own version to the tune of Ten Green Bottles but with adding instead of subtracting!

We will be counting using natural objects and during games and play, learning how to record the numbers I-5, I-10, I-20 and beyond.

Shape, Space and Measures

A wide variety of play based experiences eg shop, shape hunts, construction play, sand and water play will be on offer. The enabling environment will encourage reasoning and problem-solving.

Exploring and using midia and materials

Creative work will include fruit printing, pattern making ,colour mixing of autumn colours .

Our art studio will encourage children to express themselves in a wide variety of media and techniques with modelling and encouragement to explore.

SPECIFIC AREA: Understanding the World

We promote sharing family events and celebrations through 'All About Me 'book. This term we will celebrate Divali, Bonfire Night and Christmas .We will find out about different jobs eg police, gardener, people in our school.
