## **Safeguarding across the Curriculum**

At Redhill Primary Academy the protection of children is the responsibility of everyone. We aim to make all within the school feel safe and we have clear roles and responsibilities in place for that to happen. Safeguarding is carefully woven into our curriculum offer, ensuring that children have a broad understanding of how our school helps to keep them safe whilst in the classroom and beyond.



All schools have responsibilities relating to the safety of children in their care. Paragraph 41 of statutory guidance on **Keeping Children Safe in Education**, the Department for Education states:

"Schools should consider how children may be taught about safeguarding, including online, through teaching and learning opportunities. This may include covering relevant issues through PSHE ..."

Physical Bullying - occurs when people use their physical force and actions to exert control over, hurt or irritate the victim

Verbal Bullying – a type of bullying where the perpetrator relies mainly on words and statements to try to hurt their victim. Verbal bullying serves to lower self-esteem and undermine the confidence of the victim.

Emotional/indirect Bullying - type of bullying where the perpetrators try to isolate their victim from wider social networks

Cyber Bullying - a relatively new form of bullying which is carried out using modern forms of communication, such as the internet or mobile phones
