The previous Children's Commissioner, Anne Longfield, has fought long and hard for children's digital rights and the collection of children's personal data without consent by the big tech companies. Last month, she launched a legal campaign against TikTok on behalf of 'millions of children whose data was illegally taken and transferred to unknown third parties for profit'








#### Year 1

On Friday, we got to dress up as our future chosen career and spent time role playing this job.




















#### Year 2 - Lovell Visit










#### Year 4 - The World of Work visit from Wendy Ford

Learning on the job


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We discovered that an apprenticeship with a company such as JCB offers many exciting benefits. We also found out what would be expected in return in terms of qualifications and personal attributes!



Pulling together all of our learning from this week, the children were able to ask him about his journey to CEO and the skills, qualifications and personal attributes that have helped him along the way.






"I didn't know that you could study policing and law in university."
