Child Mental Wellbeing Research

My name is Sarah Rushton and I taught at Redhill Primary for over 15 years. I am currently undertaking a Masters in Psychology and completing a dissertation research project. Being a parent myself, I have been concerned about how the Covid-19 pandemic is impacting my children's mental health. During these times of uncertainty, I am interested in using mindfulness activities at home with children. Taking part in this research means you will be provided with free mindfulness activities that can be easily completed at home. I am interested in children between the ages of 4 and 12 years, including children with mild/moderate SEN. Due to the nature of the study, it is not recommended for adults or children who have a known clinical diagnosis of anxiety, profoundly delayed intellectual capacity or encountered traumatic personal experiences due to Covid-19. Shoe Laces

We are noticing an increasing number of children is school that are struggling to tie their shoe laces themselves, the summer holiday offers an ideal time to work on mastering this, below are a few helpful hints and links to further support.

Helpful Hints

- o Practice with the shoe or lacing template in front of the child and not while it is on the foot; this can be on a child's lap or on a table.
- o Tie two different coloured laces together (to create one long lace) so that when the child is learning; the contrast between the two sides is highlighted and it is easier to spot which part to grasp.
- o Chunkier, flat, cotton laces are easier (less slippery) to practice with than smaller, rounded laces.
- o If balance is a challenge, ask the child to sit on a chair or sit against a wall.
- o Give your child plenty of time so that they do not feel rushed (so not on your way out somewhere).
 - o During early practice, when tying the first knot, loop the lace under the base lace a second time. This helps the knot to stay firm without loosening whilst your child gets their hands ready to make the loops.


Year 1 School Trip - Preston Montford




The children were fantastically behaved and we even managed to get some sunshine!





Dear parent/carer,

We continue to help you as much as we can, particularly during the challenges that the pandemic presents. We are pleased to let you know that we have put in place free holiday clubs and activities over the Summer holidays through our Happy Healthy Active Holidays scheme.

The scheme provides a range of enjoyable activities and healthy meals, and is being delivered in partnership with local community organisations. There are a range of holiday clubs offering free places for primary and secondary school-aged children eligible for benefits related free school meals across Telford & Wrekin. However, places are limited and we expect demand to be high, so we recommend booking early to avoid disappointment. Children can attend up to 16 holiday club sessions over the Summer holidays, at no cost to you. Sessions vary in length, but most are for 4 hours a day. The sessions will include a variety of fun activities, such as sports, music or arts and craft, along with a free nutritious meal each day. There is specific provision for children with SEND or additional needs.

We are also offering a number of free family activity sessions during August, including ice skating, footgolf, and cycling. Children will be need to be accompanied by a parent or carer for these sessions, however the activity will be free for the whole family. All school-aged children attending these sessions will also get a free healthy packed lunch to take home. We also have a number of activities for unaccompanied 14-16 year olds to enjoy.



What a fabulous night!


We were so lucky with the weather and what a great way to say goodbye to this year's Redhill Leavers....
