

Science-Selfie Competition

Over the past two weeks, each of our classes has enjoyed taking part in a 'No Pens Day' which has been used in part as an added opportunity to engage in some hands-on science activities. Because this has been so well-received by the children, we thought it might be nice to share some of the things they've done, so that they can have a go at doing some simple but exciting activities at home.

To encourage participation, we are going to be running a 'Science-Selfie' competition which, as the title suggests, is simply about the children sending in a photograph of themselves doing something science-related at home. This could be taken from one of the attached suggestions, it could be something nature-related or anything else that captures their imagination. A small prize will be awarded to the best entry from each year group.

Please note that we are not expecting to see pictures of children dressed up in white lab coats, as in school we have been working towards broadening their understanding of the vast range of careers and activities that are underpinned by science.

Reception Places 2024-2025

Starting primary school is a significant milestone for your child's learning and development. Children usually start the reception year at primary school at the start of September following their fourth birthday. Children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 will start primary school from September 2024. Parents need to apply for a reception place by 15 January 2024.


To apply for a primary school place, you will need to complete and submit an online application form using the link on the Telford and Wrekin website.

You are strongly advised to apply to four local schools including your nearest or catchment area school.

You must complete an application form even if your child attends Redhill nursery.

Year 6 No Pens Day Science – Making Observations

As part of our No Pens Day, we completed a session of microscopy using a set of microscopes from the Royal Microscopical Society (RMS). The children were tasked with choosing a specimen from the box (ranging from sugar to wasps to a 2p coin), drawing what they could see and then predicting what the specimen may look like once under the microscope.

Finally, they then drew what they observed under the microscope.











PSHCE - Celebrating Differences

Today we started to think about what it meant to have power over someone. We looked at example scenarios where one person has power over another or over a group. We thought about why that person had the power before looking at how that power balance can be changed.

"The Year 3 girl has the power as she is the one telling others they can't join in."



A Year 3 girl is very popular and has a lot of friends. She tells another child that she can't join in a game as she is "Not one of the group".


"The girl who wants to join in the game has the power as she should tell an adult that she is being excluded."

"The girl's friends have the power, as they should tell her to let the other girl join in the game."

The Importance of Reading

Here at Redhill, we truly believe that reading is the key to unlocking success in all areas of the curriculum. It is one of our key priorities in ensuring that every child who leaves us at the end of year 6 is a fluent and confident reader with a real enthusiasm for books.

This is why we work so hard to promote and encourage reading, both in school and at home, from the moment children start at the Academy. As demonstrated in the image below, it is well-known that children who don't develop good reading skills from an early age, rarely catch up.



Here are some ways in which you can help your child develop a love of reading:

l spy

...play I spy games. Can you find words beginning with...? Can you find a picture of a...? How many can you see?

Make it

...enjoy reading together. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

Create

...use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

Ask questions

...ask questions about the story as you read it i.e. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Be seen

...make sure you are seen reading. Keep books and magazines at easy reach.

Go online

...look online & in app stores for appropriate word & spelling games.

Get out

...go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

Make

...have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

Read everything out loud.

Books, poems, nursery rhymes, newspaper & magazine articles, food labels...

anything that is close to hand!
