Year 2 'Choose Respect' Workshop

Last Friday, Year 2 took part in a 'Choose Respect' workshop. We discussed all the British Values and focussed on the value of respect. The workshop reinforced our school value of respect and reminded the children that we should treat others how we expect to be treated at all times. We discussed how words can be hurtful and discussed the reasons why some people chose to be unkind. We were given a challenge to spread kindness around school.





A Message from the Parents Safeguarding Board

In our most recent meeting, we were discussing the myths that surround the word safeguarding and how many see this as a taboo subject. We are hoping to dispel a few of these myths for you and give you an insight into the world of safeguarding.

There is a common misconception that 'Reporting someone to Social Services means that their children will be taken away from them immediately.' This is not the case and only happens in the most extreme circumstances where a child is at risk of immediate harm. Social workers are there to protect vulnerable children and offer support to families who need it. Sharing your concerns with social services may in fact stop this from happening, as the families will get the valuable support they need earlier and before escalation.

Another myth is that 'Involving the safeguarding team means that abuse has happened.' There are many reasons a member of the safeguarding team may be involved. There is a team within the T&W Safeguarding Partnership called Strengthening Families whose one goal is to support families with everything from eating nutritious meals to planning on a budget. They help with all elements of family life and are not social workers.

Everyone worries about friends, colleagues and family finding out that they have needed support from the safeguarding team at school or other agencies. Everything is confidential within school and the safeguarding team will only share information on a need-to-know basis with teachers who work directly with the child. If outside agencies are needed for support, this is done discretely.

We hope this has helped dispel some of these myths around safeguarding and if you have questions, please contact one of the Designated Safeguarding Leads at school or keep an eye out for the Parent Safeguarding Board at future events!

OFCOM - Online Nation Report 2023

Ofcom have released their latest top trends from people's online lives and, as always, it makes for an interesting read. Below are two of the standout trends relevant to all those involved with children and young people...

- 1. Nearly three quarters of teens said they had encountered one or more potential harms in the previous four weeks. The top 3 were:
 - Animal cruelty.
 - Promotion of suicide.
 - Promotion of self-harm.
- Around 20% of children (8-17) with a social media profile use a false age over 18. This ties in with the numbers I find in school (KS2) when I'm talking to the children and when I ask why they're using a false age it's usually one of 2 reasons:

They just use the first age (year of birth) shown when signing up - this is all about the speed of getting into the app.

• They are fully aware that if they give their true age they won't be allowed access.

The class in each key stage with the highest number of children who have taken an active journey will be rewarded with a class mufti day. The children are very excited to take part in this and we encourage you to join us.

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to build physical activity in children's daily routine which is important for their physical health and mental wellbeing.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. <u>A 2021</u> <u>YouGov study</u> showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school. And that children thought active travel was the best away to bring down these pollution levels.

Plus there are some great prizes to be won every day, if we get enough children taking part!



Chocolate Hamper Prize Draw

Prize Draws are the same as a raffle except that you must answer a multiple-choice question when you purchase tickets! (Prize Draws turn a game of chance (Raffles) into a game of skill (Prize Draw) and are therefore exempt from UK Gambling legislation).

When you add prize draw tickets to your basket, you will be asked a question when you checkout and you must agree to the terms and conditions of the draw. Only those participants who correctly answer the questions will be eligible for the prize draw. All customers will be sent the number of tickets that they have purchased. For example, if you purchase a £2 ticket and a £5 ticket you'll receive 7 e-tickets with unique numbers. When you answer the question correctly, you'll be entered into the prize draw.

When the prize draw has been held, all winning ticket holders will be notified immediately via email. The event detail page will also show winning ticket numbers.
