Who can participate?

Adults: 18 years or older.

Must be parents of children from being 4 years of age to not older than 12 years of age or have experience working with primary school-aged children.

What is involved?

One **online questionnaire**. The single session will take approximately 60 minutes to complete.

The questions cover the following topics: frequency of emotions in everyday life, prosocial behaviour, emotion regulation, as well as technology and emotions.

A **£20 voucher** as reimbursement for completing the survey. All responses will be stored anonymously and securely.
