Reception 2023 Admissions

The online application form for children starting school in September 2023 is now available via the Telford and Wrekin website <u>www.telford.gov.uk/admissions</u>

To apply for a Reception 2023 place, parents will need to use the online system.

Please note:

Parents will need to make an application to the Local Authority where they live i.e. where they pay their council tax.

If a child is attending nursery, they must still apply for a school place.

The deadline for applying for a school place is 15 January 2023.

There is no guarantee of a place at the school even if a child has been attending their nursery or pre-school.

More information is available at www.telford.gov.uk/admissions around school allocations and oversubscription criteria.

If a child has an **Education, Health and Care Plan,** the closing date is **31 October 2022** for all applications. The school admissions website contains lots of information around school admissions www.telford.gov.uk/admissions.

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<u>Mini Medics After School Club</u> - First Aid for Children Run by Edufit4schools Dear Parents of Year 4, 5 and 6 Children

We are delighted to inform you that we have organised an after school Mini Medics Course to run on Friday 13th January, Friday 20th January, Friday 26th January, Friday 3rd February and Friday 10th February from 3-4pm.

The course is a very basic introduction to first aid and defibrillation for children and is aimed at children between the ages of 8 and 11. The course is kept at a basic level with no use of confusing terminologies. The course will show complete respect for the child's ability, make it educational and practical, and instil the importance of helping someone who is poorly or injured.

The Mini Medics Course covers:

The first aid book and box, primary survey, CPR, recovery position, choking, asthma, treating wounds, slings and bandages and how to use a defibrillator.

The children will receive an individual Mini Medics® training pack which will include:

• Fully illustrated 32-page 'First Aid and Defibrillation for Children' book.

• A unique syringe pen in red or blue.

Certificate.

The cost of the course is £20. If you would like your child to take part, please head over to ParentPay to secure your child's place. Places are limited and are on a first come first served basis.

Domestic Abuse?

Domestic Abuse is any behaviour which is violent, controlling, coercive or threatening to those aged 16 or over. The abuser may be a partner, ex-partner, family carer or one or more family members, in an existing or from a previous domestic relationship.

What is Domestic Abuse?

There are many forms of abuse:

- Behaviours' that damage the person's confidence and sense of wellbeing, e.g. being told that they are ugly, stupid, useless or crazy, being accused of things they haven't done and being told that the abuse is their fault (also known as Gas lighting)
- Intimidation
- · Isolation from family and friends
- · Restriction or control over money or fi-nances
- Control of what they can wear or who they can meet
- Forced marriage
- Neglect
- Being locked in the house or restricted to a particular room.
- Threats to harm family members, friends or pets.
- Physical abuse e.g. beating, throttling.

Domestic abuse victims are often made to feel, by their abuser, that they won't be believed if they seek help, or fear further abuse towards themselves, their children, relatives, or friends. Domestic abuse can affect anyone regardless of ethnicity, age, gender, sexuality or social background.

Keeping Safe

If you want to stay with your partner

Our priority is to ensure that you are as safe as you can be. The most important thing to remember is that you can't stop the abuse yourself, only the abuser can do that. However, there are steps you can take to increase the safety of yourself and your children whilst remaining with your partner.

If you want to leave

You should plan ahead for your safety. It is a very stressful time both emotionally and practically, you'll have a lot to deal with.

Whether you want to stay or leave there are local services available to support you through that process, contact details are in this leaflet.



Remember, you are not to blame for what is happening. You are not alone, and above all you do not have to suffer in silence – help is available.



Know their history?

Clare's Law, also known as the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (DVDS), means that anyone, including a close friend of family member can ask the police about a partner of someone they care about. To put an application just visit your local police station.

Facts and Figures

- Two thirds of domestic incidents that are known to the police were found to involve at least one individual within a couple to have been 'under the influence'.
- The Office for National Statistics (ONS) 2019 published statistics stating that two women per week are killed by a current of former partner in England and Wales alone.
- One in three victims of domestic abuse are male. This equates to 757,000 men.
- Almost half of male victims (49%) fail to tell anyone that they are a victim of domestic abuse, and are two and a half times less likely to tell anyone compared to female victims.
