Reception 2025/2026 Applications

For reception places in September 2025, applications are available via the

Telford & Wrekin website

All parents need to apply via the Telford and Wrekin Parent Portal.

Please note:

Parents will need to make an application to the Local Authority of where they are living; this is where they pay Council Tax to, even if they want to apply for a school in another LA area.

If a child is attending a school-based nursery, they still need to apply for a school place.

Parents can include up to 4 preferences on their application and we recommend that they do this, and include their catchment/nearest school.

The deadline is as follows:

Reception: 15th January 2025

Christmas. It was a fun and interesting morning for us all.








OROYAL MUSEUM AIR FORCE COSFORD

Following on from our history block on the innovations of warfare from 1914-1945, children visited the RAF Cosford museum. Here, they were able to see much of the weaponry developed during these conflicts. We saw the bi-planes that were used in World War One such as the Sopworth Pup. We then learned about the advent of planes with jet engines, which were able to fly at much greater speeds and over greater distances (such as the famous Spitfire). Finally, we were able to stand under the huge bombing doors of Avro bombers, which allowed these monsters of the air to drop their huge payloads on the towns and cities of Europe in World War II, turning the tide of the conflict into the favour of the Allies. Linked to our block, we were also able to see the V1 'doodlebug' bombs - known as Hitler's vengeance weapons - in real life and the fearsome V2.


