Critical Worker Children

Schools have received updated guidance sent by the DfE, reiterated by the Council, that children with at least one parent or carer who is a critical worker, should keep their children at home if they can. Can we ask that if this is possible, that you do so, so we can keep the numbers of pupils in school as low as possible, for everyone's safety. Part time attendance is permissible and does not affect your child's attendance, if you are a critical worker.

Please remember to inform the school office if you child is not going to attend school on the days when you are able to keep them at home.

Online learning - Policy Update

Our Online Learning Expectations document states the following: Ensure that pupils are in an appropriate room if learning at home. (This MUST NOT be a bedroom.)

Whilst it is ideal for children to be accessing their online lessons in a communal area within the home, we understand that this is not always possible and that a child's bedroom may be the only room of the house that enables a quiet workspace, particularly in the case of older children who are able to access their online lessons independently.

Therefore, a bedroom is suitable but please ensure that your child uses a blurred background on Microsoft Teams and leaves their bedroom door open so that an adult is able to supervise as and when appropriate.
