The Big Walk and Wheel

20th March 2023 until 31st March 2023

We are, once again, taking part in Sustrans' Big Walk and Wheel, the UK's largest inter-school cycling, walking, wheeling and scooting challenge. The challenge runs from 20th March to 31st March 2023.

It's a free challenge and we would love everyone to be involved.

What do you need to do?

Please support the school and encourage your child(ren) to take active journeys to school, on as many days as possible, during the event. Each day, teachers will record how many children have come into school by an alternative way to a car. This can include walk, bike, scooter or park and stride. The total number of children who have taken part will be collected at the end of the week and the winning class in both key stages will win a class mufti day. The children are very excited to be involved in this and we encourage you to take part where possible. We do not have sufficient space to house all bikes and scooters, so we are asking that, where possible, scooters and bikes are taken back home after dropping off. We appreciate that this maybe easier for the parents of children in Reception, year 1, and 2 as the bikes and scooters will be smaller.

Why we are taking part

Sustrans' Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to get children active, which is important for physical health and mental wellbeing. Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. Plus, there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part! They range from micro scooters, cycle parking for schools, playground markings, bikes and accessories. - Payment by childcare vouchers is now an option when making a booking.

We will be running the EKO Holiday Club in conjunction with the **Holiday Activity and Food programme, (HAF)**. HAF is a government funded initiative set up to provide support during the school holidays for families who have children eligible for benefits related free school meals. We are delighted that EKO has been able to secure funding from **Shropshire & Staffordshire Councils**. If you have received a code for your child, either from your school or through your council's website, places at our Holiday Club will be FREE from 10:30am. If you wish to start at the earlier time of 9:00am there will be a small charge of £5.

A hot lunch and healthy snacks are all part of the day. We'll be mindful of dietary choices and food allergies, but EKO is all about having a go so we will be encouraging children to try new foods. However, please be assured that no one will go hungry!

All sessions will be based at Weston Park, using our dedicated **EKO Outdoor Learning Site** as well as the extensive grounds of Weston Park. Dear parent/carer,

We know that many people are struggling as a result of rising food and energy bills.

To show we are firmly on your side we have detailed in this letter a package of support for families to stay healthy and happy during the Easter holidays.

Food vouchers

Families with children who receive income-related Free School Meals or early year pupil premium or talking 2's funding, may be eligible for food e-vouchers.

Codes that can be redeemed for e-vouchers were issued on 10 February 2023.

The vouchers are worth £15 per child per week of the February half term and Easter holidays (so a total of £45 per eligible child). They can be used at local supermarkets.
