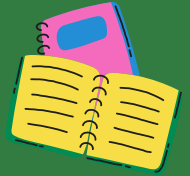

## WHY IS FAIRTRADE IMPORTANT?

Fairtrade ensures producers in developing countries receive a minimum guaranteed price for their goods, protecting them from volatile market fluctuations. Fairtrade promotes environmentally responsible farming practices, restricts the use of harmful pesticides, and encourages producers to work toward better land and water stewardship. Fairtrade standards ~~prohibits~~ forced labour, and require safe working environments.
