In the afternoon, we roasted marshmallows around a bonfire and made delicious smores!

Careers Week-Being an Engineer



On Monday 24th June, we had the pleasure of Mr Morris, a mechanical engineer for Rolls Royce, visiting us to discuss careers in engineering. We talked about Thomas Telford (who was given the honour of having our town named after him) and his engineering feats which can be seen locally and around the country.

An engineer is a person who designs, builds or creates a solution to a problem. They have to ask 3 key questions:

What is the problem to be solved? Who has the problem?

Why is the problem important enough to be solved?

We learned that the Golden Gate Bridge was created to solve the issue of people being able to travel to and from work in San Francisco. A bridge was found to be the best solution, and it was designed to withstand the expected high level of vehicles that would travel across it.

We discussed NASA's plans to travel to Mars via the moon (Project Artemis), and our expectation that within the lifetimes of the children, humans will be able to live on the planet.

Mr Morris is an engineer for Rolls Royce, who works on submarines. Over 7000 engineers work together to deliver a submarine as they are incredibly complex machines. Working with components and machinery, he works with a team designing the relevant components (including the nuclear reactor) before passing the design to manufacturers. Computer Aided Design (CAD) is used in the design process. 3D printing is an evolving technology that is now being used in the manufacturing process. Powered by nuclear energy, it takes 30 years before these submarines need refuelling, and UK submarines have travelled over 18 million miles (to the moon and back 37 times). One submarine costs £2 billion!

There is a shortage of engineers, and the next generation of engineers need to come forwards. Some ideas that will help aspiring engineers along this path:

Work in teams
Believe in yourself
Problem solve

Help adults with repairs around the house English, maths, science and IT are great subjects to lead into this field

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING

FIRST OFFENCE



The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered. The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.



THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period.
